

Our speaker: **Dr. Philip Meadows** is a Professor of Evangelization Studies at Asbury Theological Seminary since July 2017. In the past, Dr. Meadows had served as a faculty member at Westminster College, Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, and Cliff College. He was also once a senior research fellow at Nazarene Theological College and a research fellow at the University of Manchester, where he supervises Ph.D. students in Wesleyan studies and missiology. He is an ordained Presbyter with the Irish Methodist Church.

Dr. Meadows founded the **INSPIRE MOVEMENT**, an international network of Christians who develop and share discipleship practices in the Wesleyan spirit. His current research studies the intersection of Wesleyan theology and spirituality with discipleship, leadership and mission for 21^{st} century churches. He is a prolific writer, authoring several books and scholarly articles in the areas of missiology within a digital culture, church planting, spirituality and discipleship, Wesleyan studies, and church leadership.

His recent works include 'Mission and Discipleship in a Digital Culture', Mission Studies; The DNA of Discipleship and Windows on Wesley: Wesleyan Theology in Today's World; Remembering Our Baptism: Discipleship and Mission in the Wesleyan Spirit.

Dr. Meadows holds a Ph.D. from Cambridge University. His undergraduate education (University College, London) is in Biochemistry, along with a Bachelor of Arts in Theology and Religious Studies (Cambridge). His postgraduate education includes a Certificate in Education (Durham), a Master of Philosophy in Computer Science (Bradford), and a Master of Arts in Theology (Cambridge).
